Reunion A Big Success

Sounds of greetings and expressions of joy at seeing old friends were again overheard in the CRHS auditorium, dining hall, and dance pavilion during the second annual reunion of the Alumni Association of Cedar Rapids held Sunday, August 6, 1961.

Registration went smoother this year—with several tables doing the registering. 273 members signed the register and received their name tags between 12 and 2 p. m. There was a table for those from 1890 to 1920 and a table for every ten years thereafter and a special table for the St. Anthony grads.

At 2 p. m. the program was held. Larry Massman, '44, was the master of ceremonies. Dillard Farmer, '40, Alumni President, welcomed all classes. Ila Mae Bulow, nee Tschudin, '49, sang a solo in her usual strong, clear voice. Ila Mae now lives in Grand Island, Nebr.

Next on the program came the introductions and responses of the honored classes. The program committee elected to honor this year's graduating class (class of '61), the graduating class of twenty-five years ago (class of '36), fifty years ago (class of '11), and also the classes of 1899, 1902, 1904 and 1906. Special effort was made by the members of those honored classes to be here.

Responding for the class of 1899 was Earl McClintick, Ed-dyville, Nebraska. For 1902 was Grace Fox, Cedar Rapids, Nebraska. For 1904 was Mrs. James McClintick, nee Edna Fox, now of Victor, Colorado.

Responding for 1906 was Sallie Fox, Cedar Rapids, Nebraska. Mrs. Ralph Eacker, nee Odessa King, Ewing, Nebraska, responded for the 1911 CRHS graduating class.

Homer McPheeters, 679 W. Arbor Vitae, Inglewood, California, responded for the class of 1936. For the latest class to graduate, Jim Cox responded. Jim is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Maurice Cox (Mrs. Cox was Marjorie Robinson '37), Cedar Rapids, Nebraska.

Jerry and Rita Gordon play-

ed a piano duet. They are the children of Mr. and Mrs. James J. Gordon (nee Leona Schmid S. A. '33). Jim J. Gordon graduated from CRHS in '31.

Larry Massman asked for a moment of silence in remembrance of Ralph Brooks, former Superintendent of CRHS and Governor of Nebraska.

Next on the program was a vocal solo by Kenneth Smiley '54, of Cedar Rapids.

The program speaker was Heribert Birkfeld, 19, of Dortmund, West Germany. Heribert and 97 other young West Germans are visiting families in Nebraska, Iowa, Wisconsin and Chicago. They pay their own transportation and are in the States three weeks.

Mr. Birkfeld is an iron worker for the Hoesch Iron & Steel Company in Dortmund, Germany. He attended grade

school four years, high school four years and two years of commercial school. He still studies English at night school.

Heribert spoke of his home in Germany which is located in West Germany, about fifty miles from the Netherlands. Dortmund is in the Rhine Valley and is best known for its iron, steel and agriculture. The cities' size is 618,300 or a little better than twice the size of Omaha.

Mr. Birkfeld was visiting the Mel Levander home in Albion. Mr. Levander operates a furniture store and funeral home.

Invocation and Benediction was given by Rev. John Zemanek, Pastor of the Cedar Rapids Methodist church.

Piano accompaniment for the musical numbers was again by Mrs. Larry Massman, nee Catherine Siemek, '44.

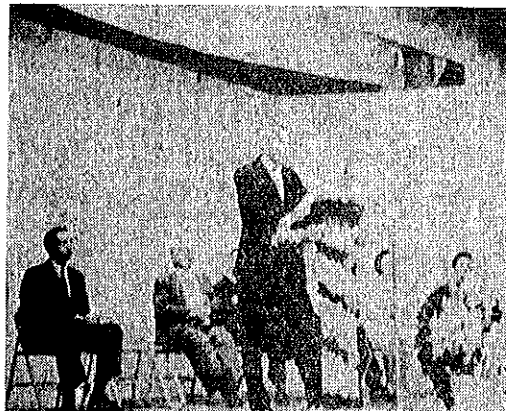

At a meeting of the new officers and committees, it was decided to honor the classes of every ten years as well as the twenty-five year and fifty year class.

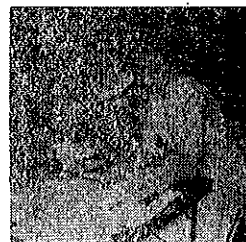

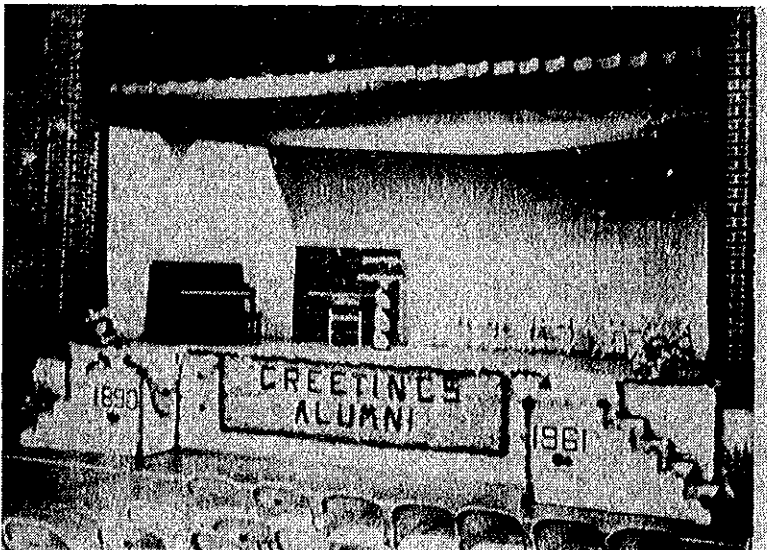

Picture display

1921, second in state

Cedar Rapids High School took second place in the state basketball tournament in Class L in 1921. All the teams in the state went to Lincoln in those years. They had classes from A to W.

Cedar beat Winside and Verango at Lincoln to get to the finals. That is the farthest our school had ever gotten and the record still stands.

Cedar had scouted Waterloo and was confident of a state championship. However, two tall Waterloo players, well over six feet, threw up a barrier that our boys were not used to and couldn't cope with. Cedar could score only two field goals and one free throw and lost 20 to 5. Second place trophy was a brand new basketball.

This game was played in the old YMCA gym in Lincoln. Every gym in town was in use during the tournament. The larger schools played in the old Armory.

Superintendent and Coach Fred Schieder had a team in 1921 that lost only two games, the one already mentioned and one to the Genoa Indians. Cedar beat all other towns around including the much larger schools nearby.

Fred Cornwell was a senior and the team captain of the Tigers in 1921. Fred and his teammates played in the basement on the North side of the old school that burned in 1939. Many were the times Fred jogged home seven miles after school in order to play basketball and make the team.

The play was rough in those days. Only one ref, and he mainly was there to handle the ball on jumps. In 1919 Fred Cornwell had his nose broken three times, and each time it was by his own teammate, and the same teammate each time.

51 classes represented

There were fifty-one CRHS classes represented at the reunion this year as compared to fifty-seven last year.

Cedar Rapids High School started in 1890.

Ten of the fifteen St. Anthony classes were represented (1918-1933).

St. Anthony's had eleven classes represented last year.

Committee meeting

A meeting was held in the high school August 9, 1981, to discuss the last reunion. All committee heads were present.

Reminders will be sent out June 1 for the next reunion.

Suggestions were made during the meeting to improve our next reunion. One suggestion was to have an extra microphone down on the floor to pick up what those in the honor classes say.

Rob Jackson was installed as 1982 President and Dillard Farmer thanked his committee people for their help in the past. \$35 will be paid to the secretary each year. The alumni bank balance is \$643.73.

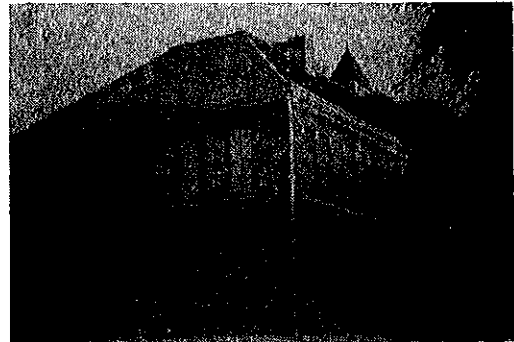
