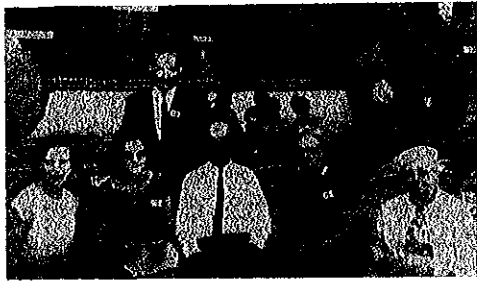

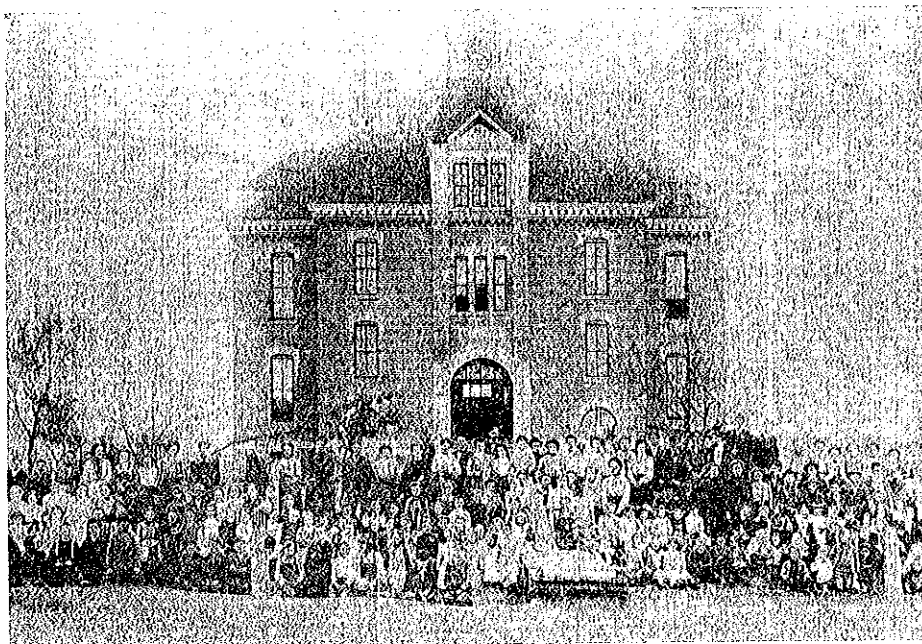

# Cedar Rapids High School Girls Gain National Recognition In Track And Field Meets

Who ever heard of a track team, a girls' team at that, being developed on a dusty road surrounding a sand pit?

This is exactly where the Cedar High girls' track team that we now recognize for their skill and talent, began practice. The reason for such a look is given by Coach Randall T. Lambert, "We do not have a regular track so we use this." The girls call themselves the "Road Runners." This name was seemingly picked by their "running and practicing on the road."

The pretty quartet includes Carol Jean Moseke, 17, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Moseke; Sue VanDeWalle, 16, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Frank VanDeWalle; Patti Webster, and suggested putting their energy to good use in track.

Success came right away for the girls. The team placed second at the Midwestern District AAU meet at Fremont 15, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Blane Webster, and Bonnie Yilk, 17, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Florence (Dinger) Yilk. Since the organization of the team in

March, 1962, three more girls have joined. They are Joan Yilk, 15, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Florence (Dinger) Yilk; Lavonne Ewing, 16, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Gordon Ewing, and Dolores Haschke, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Bernard Haschke.

Coach Lambert, a Columbus, Nebraska native and former sports editor of the Daily Nebraskan at his alma mater and a track enthusiast, although just a "so-so half-miler" at Wilfield, Kansas High School, said he'd noticed the girls participating in sports after school and tied for second at another AAU meet at Cozad.

In Carol, a pretty blonde, the coach found one of those "one in a million natural athletes."

The statuesque five foot seven inch girl scored 50 1/2 of the teams 89 points at Fremont. Teamate Patti, a mighty mite of 98 pounds on a five foot frame, scored 27 1/2 points for the team.

After such performances, Coach Lambert and his wife took Carol and Patti to the Los Angeles Coliseum on July 7

and 8, 1962, for the National AAU Girls' and Women's Track and Field Championships. Here the Cedar Rapids colors were carried to the victory stand.

Patti failed to place except in the hearts of the girls of the Japanese Olympic team which she met. But Carol took second in the shotput in the girls division with a heave of 38 feet, 11 1/2 inches.

Carol Jean Moseke received another honor when she received a plaque for being named the "Outstanding Woman Track Athlete" in the Midwestern AAU District. This territory includes Nebraska, South Dakota, and Western Iowa.

On March 4, 1963, Coach Lambert, along with Carol, Bonnie and Patti appeared on KHAS-TV, Channel 5, Hastings. Bob Wirtz, KHAS-TV sports director interviewed the coach and the girls on his program "Sports Panorama."

The week end following their television appearance, several members of the team ventured to Fort Collins, Colorado, for the Rocky Mountain Women's AAU Indoor Track and Field Championships. The Cedar Roadrunners tied for second place in this meet. Carol Jean set a record in the four-kilo shotput, hitting 40 feet, 2 inches. Carol Jean also took fourth in the 50 yard hurdles and the broad jump. In the 40, Patti was second to Tomoko's record breaker, Carol Thomas. Sue VanDeWalle was fourth in the 40.

The girls finished ahead of such teams as Colorado State University, Denver VFW Striders, New Mexico Track Club, Loveland, Colorado, and Cheyenne, Wyoming.

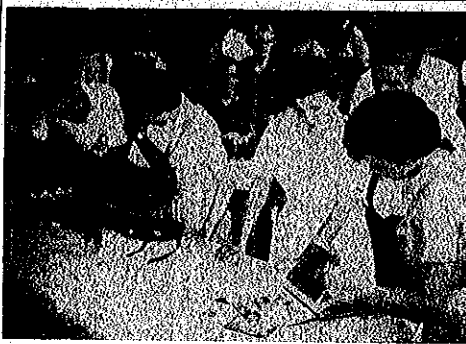
Although proud of his girls' athletic abilities, Coach Lambert is prouder still of their scholastic accomplishments. The pride is shared by School Superintendent, Vernon T. Hanneman.

Mr. Hanneman stated: "We are proud of these girls. It isn't very often that kids want to follow through on a special talent. These girls set up a goal clear outside the realm of homemakers and are making a success of it."

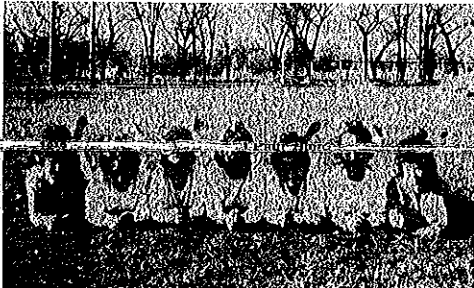

### Alumni Scholarship?

In recent weeks we have had suggestions from several local alumni regarding a scholarship grant to a graduating senior from our high school whose scholastic record during his or her high school course is outstanding.

After some investigation of scholarships given by some alumni associations in the surrounding area it was found that they, as a whole, operate under the same rules and regulations.

One nearby Alumni Association issues a certificate to that senior whose scholastic record during his high school course has been outstanding. It is not transferable. It is given only to a student qualified under the rules of the association and may be invalidated if the student becomes a subject of censure or discipline. The certificate issued will be paid at the end of the first semester of college provided the student's grades are passing. If not redeemed within three years, the money will revert back to the general alumni fund. Most generally we find that the scholarship amounts to an average of fifty dollars.

This looks like a very commendable endeavor for any alumni association and we would appreciate your comments.

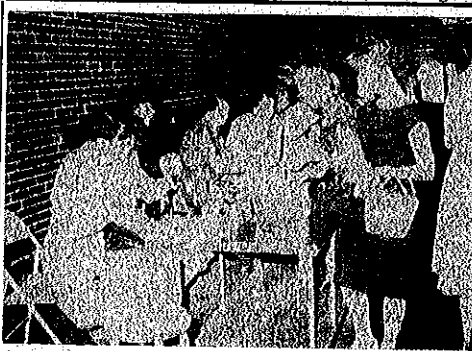
Help keep our records complete. From year to year addresses of a number of the alumni are changed. We would appreciate having these alumni send in their address changes so that we may send them news from their home town.
