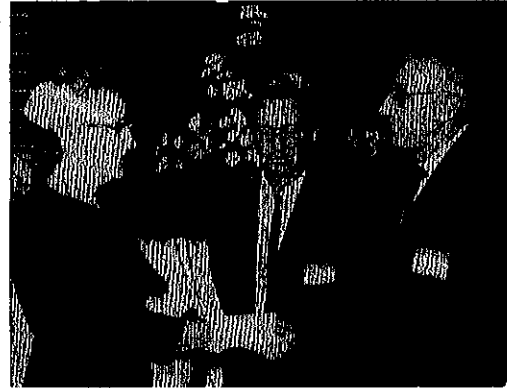
Louis S. Gibb, graduate of 1925, fourth annual CRHS reunion speaker

The Cedar Rapids High School and the St. Anthony's High School held their 4th annual Reunion Sunday, August 4, 1963 with a program and open house at the Public School Auditorium in the afternoon. Ray Gordon, class of 1933 was Master of Ceremonies for the afternoon program. The invocation and benediction was given by Rev. Marie Hahn, local Minister of the Methodist Church. 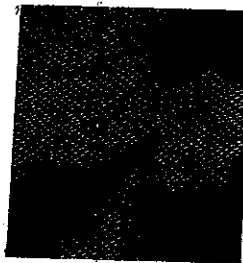
Sylvester Rolf's wife, the former Mary Fenton, was a member of the honor class celebrating the 25th year.

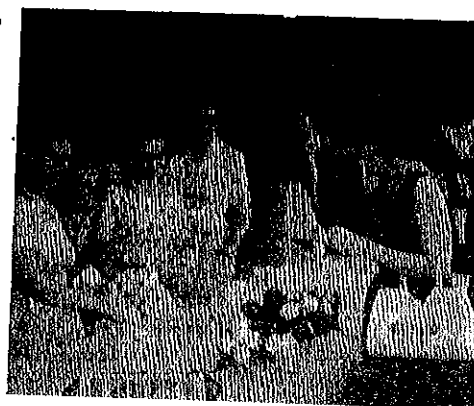

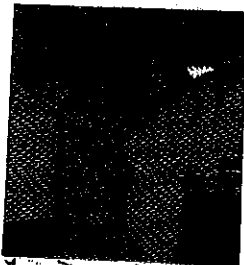

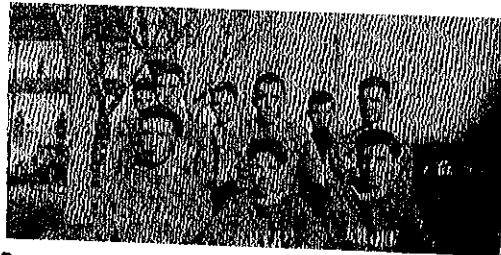
