Registration began at 1 p.m. in the C.R.H.S. auditorium. Old grads signed in and either checked their previous reservations and dues payments or paid their dues and got name plates to wear. A crew of eight, including the Alumni secretary, handled the job of registration in the one hour before the program started.

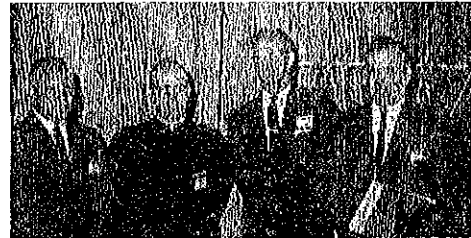
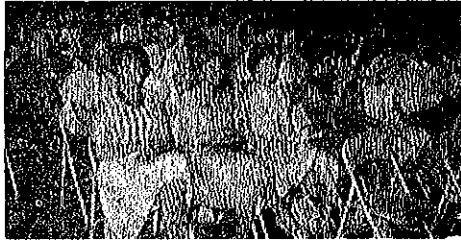

The guest speaker was Charles Lutz of Houston, Texas who is married to the former Jean Kennedy, class of '41. Mr. Lutz is an assistant chief in the National Aero Space Program. The former native of Iowa is a supervisor of equipment in the program and gave an interesting talk about space, its problems, and the why of attempting to conquer outer space by the United States. He had a complete space suit and survival equipment with him that he demonstrated. He also had a color film on the development of the program entitled "Filling the Pipe Lines."

Open House was held in the C.R.H.S. auditorium following the program. Punch and cookies were served by the committee to the two hundred and one alumni who registered and their guests.

A Banquet dinner was held at the St. Anthony dining hall between 5 and 7 p.m. to those who had reservations. The results of the balloting for new officers was announced at the dinner. Balloting was done during the one hour registration period. The last year's Vice President automatically becomes the Alumni President. The balloting was to elect the new Vice President, new secretary and the new treasurer.

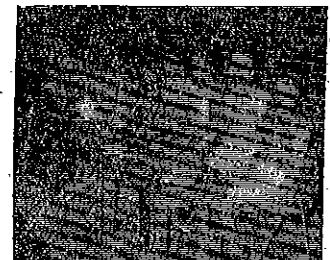

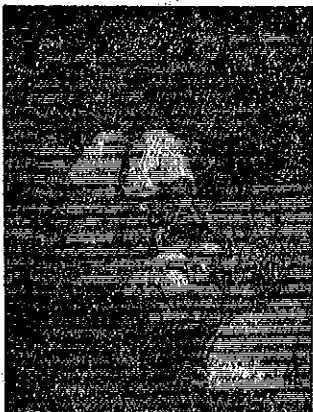

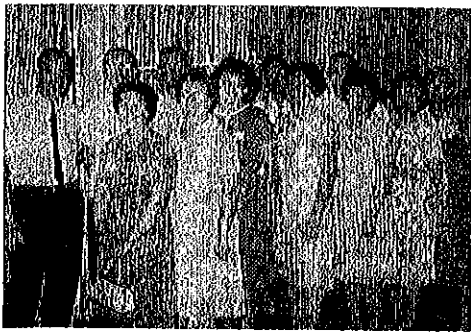

Sunday, August 2, 1964, was the hottest August 2nd in Lincoln, Nebraska since 1930, according to the Weather Bureau office. The bureau reported a sizzling 107 degrees at 3 p.m. the same high recorded on that date 34 years ago. It was just as warm in Cedar Rapids that day, as many of the alumni will testify.

On August 25, 1964, the temperature in Boone County was down to 43 degrees. That same day, Omaha had a record low of 49 degrees.

This represents a spread of 64 degrees in a matter of 23 days last August.

TORNADO



SOMEONE ONCE LIVED HERE

The above picture was one taken of the residential district of Primrose, Nebraska the day after the tornado of May 8, 1965. It hit the Cedar Rapids neighbor at about 5:05 p.m. that Saturday afternoon. Kenneth Kolm '38 and his wife Esther, (Cain '38) and their family lived in the residential district of Primrose that was hit. They were not injured, but there were four persons who were killed that afternoon. Mrs. Myrtle Barry, Mrs. Almer Oleson and her son Wayne, and a young McBride girl who was about 12 years old.

Also in the heart of the storm, Mr. and Mrs. Harold Treptow (she is Yvonne Dobson '59) had a frightening experience. The Treptows and their children went to the Southwest corner of their

basement seconds before their house was hit. The house was completely blown away. Mrs. Treptow had all the hair pins pulled out of her hair and her husband had the shirt torn from his back. They were both weightless for a time as the suction lifted them from the floor and dropped them back as the funnel cloud went on.

The path of the tornado pretty much followed Main Street, flattening almost everything on both sides of the street. Spared were the churches, school, auditorium and several residential homes, however, most of these were damaged to some extent.

All the boys and girls from Cedar Rapids High School spent one day in Primrose a few days after the storm helping clean up the debris.

Nebraska Centennial

Nebraska will hold their State Centennial in 1967. The first class graduated at Cedar Rapids high school just 23 years after Nebraska became a State.

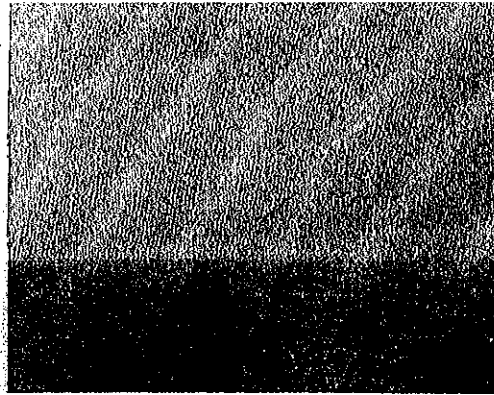


The First reunion
