CEDAR RAPIDS ALUMNI REUNION IS BIG SUCCESS

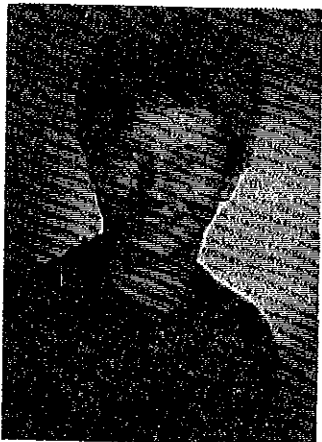
The sixth annual Cedar Rapids High School and St. Anthony reunion was held in the high school auditorium Sunday, Aug. 1, 1966, and again, was well attended.

Dick Jackson, '44, acted as Master of Ceremonies, and the program opened with invocation being given by Rev. Mrs. Hahn, pastor of the Cedar Rapids and Belgrade Methodist Churches. The welcome was given by Tom Mahoney '52, President of the Alumni Association. The Vice President, who will automatically become the President of the Association in 1966, was introduced. He is Kenneth Smiley '54.

The members of the family of Ed and Margaret Swerczek (nee Margaret Zuerlein '42) sang two selections entitled "Beautiful Brown Eyes" and "Little White Duck."

Next on the program were the responses from the members of the Honor Classes. The first to respond was Mrs. Luella Dodds Rine, class of 1915. She mentioned that she attended Belgrade her first year of high school, but wanted to become a teacher, so transferred to Cedar Rapids and took Normal Training her Junior and Senior years. There were twelve in the class of '15 eleven girls and one boy. Mrs. Rine was the only one from this class in attendance at this year's alumni.

Carol Moseke, a '63 graduate of C. R. H. S. has carved a niche for herself in the annals of the sports world. She was able to break 5 records in 3 days.

During the Missouri Valley AAU championships in Topeka, Kans. on Saturday, May 28, 1966, she collected records of 48-8½ in the shot, 141-6½ in the javelin and 156-2 with the eight-pound discus. Then during the ninth annual Mid-States Federation Track Championships at Haymaker Stadium, Cozad, on May 30 she threw the discus 161-3, the best women's throw in the nation this year. After this tremendous throw she heaved the shot 47-8½.

We the alumni of C. R. H. S. can cheer her on to greater successes. Go, Carol, Go.

Lester Bourn, Sr. gave the response for the class of 1925. Lester was the class President during his senior year and mentioned that the "great" class of '25 had 14 members - seven boys and seven girls. Their colors were blue and silver and the class sponsor was a Miss King, who later became the wife of Dr. W. B. Bering of Cedar Rapids. Their professor was Wayne Sharrard and the Principal was Miss Wilde.

The response of the class of 1935 was given by Francis R. Towey, who mentioned that there were 26 in their class and their colors were blue and gold. The motto was "Forward ever, backward never."

The twenty fifth anniversary class was the class of 1940. "Windy" Roberts gave the class response. His home is now Weeping Water, Nebr. There were 31 members in the class of '40.

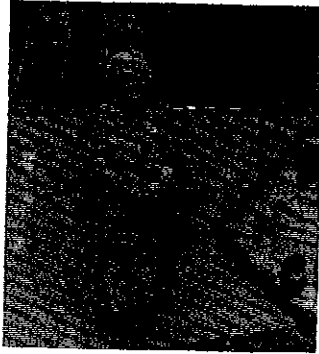

Mrs. Estella Miller is the oldest alumni; class of 1891

Mrs. Estella (Sunderland) Miller, the oldest living graduate, graduated with the second class to come out of Cedar Rapids High School in 1891.

Her father, Samuel W. Sunderland, brought his family to the emerging community in the Cedar Valley in 1883 from Burlington Junction, Missouri. They had met disaster at the hands of violent weather, and so decided to seek new opportunities in a different area of the country. A friend of the family had settled in the Albion territory and had spoken of the new territory being settled in the Cedar Valley, which became their choice for a new home. Mr. Sunderland then operated the first lumber yard in Cedar Rapids.

Our heroine was ten years of age when the family settled here, and so attended school shortly after their arrival in a one room school building located on the southeast corner of the block where the present school plant is located. It was from this building that she was graduated in 1891. At the time there were three teachers, she recalls, and the superintendent was a George Crozier. The county Superintendent of Schools at that time was E. A. Enright. She was one of a class of seven to be graduated that year. She was able to recall for this reporter the names of the other members of the class as she remembered them. She listed them as Ollie Baird, Belle Phillips, Bertha Brown, Will Baker, (herself) and possibly her brother Will Sunderland and Harry Stewart. She was an

honor student and gave the valedictory address for her class.

Mrs. Miller related that she was blessed with a musical talent, and throughout her school career she was active in the musical program offered, taking part in the band and singing groups. She takes great pride in the fact that she has been able to continue her singing throughout most of her life for the benefit of her community and church. Christianity has always taken a central position in her life, either with music, teaching or wherever her talents would be of service. She has continued to have a deep and abiding faith through many obstacles and hardships.

Mrs. Miller has always set a very active pace for herself these 74 years since she left the hallowed halls of Cedar Rapids High School. She has always taken pride in the community she has helped to shape as time has brought many changes during that time.

VIEW of the new Fire Hall being constructed presently. Familiar City Hall is at left.

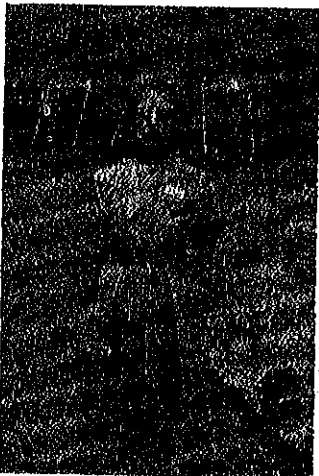
Cedar Rapids Rural Fire Department has been accepted into the Clark - McNary Water Shed Fire Program. The fire department sports a rescue unit which is a new service offered by the fire department. The Cedar Rapids American Legion Post furnished all First Aid Equipment for the rescue unit.

The Clarke-McNary Program also made available a quonset type building to the fire department. This building, 60' x 100' will house the four units of fire fight-

ing and the rescue unit.

Members of the Cedar Rapids Fire Department and other volunteers traveled to Boxholm, Ia. early on a Saturday last November to dismantle the steel building. Boxholm is located about 60 miles north of Des Moines.

Fifteen men spent 225 man-hours during operations of dismantling the building and returning to Cedar Rapids with the material for the new Firehouse.

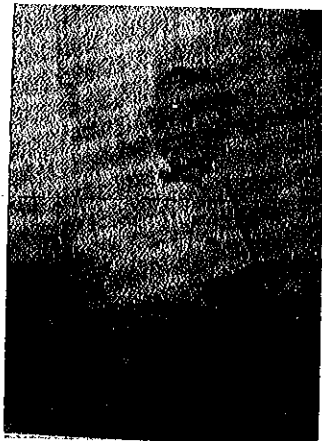

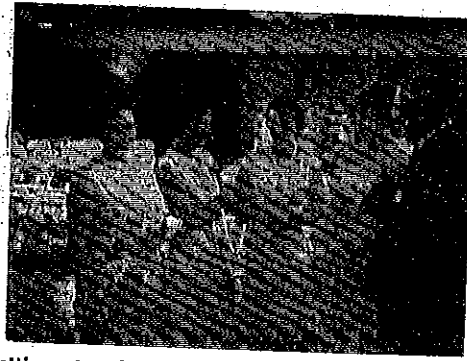
GRADUATES REGISTERED
