OLD FRIENDS, CLASS MATES HAD GATHERING

The Cedar Rapids High school and St. Anthony's high school held their seventh annual alumni reunion on Sunday, Aug. 7, 1966 starting with a program held at the school gymnasium at 2 p.m.

Lester E. Bourn '25, vice president of the alumni association, welcomed the alumni and acted as Master of Ceremonies. Rev. Harry Feistner, pastor of the Cedar Rapids Lutheran church, offered a prayer to open the program.

Kenneth Smiley, '54 was introduced to the audience as the president of the association. He thanked everyone for coming and the committees for serving this year.

During the open house, which was held from 1 to 2 p. m., persons were contacted to give a response for their honored class. Mr. Bourn explained that this had to be done in this manner as they had no way of knowing who would be there and could speak for their class.

Speaking for the 60 year class of 1906 was Sallie Fox of Cedar Rapids.

Howard Smith, who's father had a jewelry store in Cedar Rapids, gave the response for the class of 1916. He now lives in Redlands, Calif. He mentioned that they had a "four story - 13 year education" . . . all the school years were spent in the same building. This was the old school house which burnt in 1939.

St. Anthony's class of 1926 was the next to be honored. Response was made by Helen Thompson, nee Gordon, Madison, Wisc. (see picture of the members present, elsewhere in this paper). The class of '26 for CRHS was represented by Louis Casper of Britt, Ia.

The class of 1936 response was given by Homer McPheeters of Cascade, Colo. Five were in attendance (see picture of them elsewhere in this paper).

The 25 year class (class of '41 was represented ably by a Texan who could not resist bragging on his new home state - Atley "Pat" Gaddie from Graham, Tex. Nine members of his class were in attendance. Pat mentioned he was disappointed that in 1965 the CRHS football team had to quit in the middle of the season due to a lack of players. (Editors note: The 1966 football record of CRHS was the best, since 1947, when they had a perfect season. The Tigers lost the second game of the season

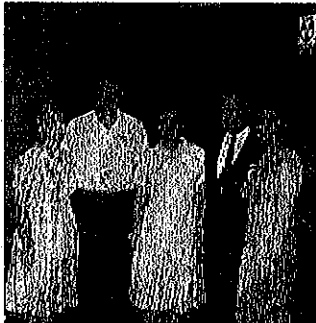
to Rising City, but won all the others - including a victory over Platte Center 45 to six. Platte Center had previously won over Rising City by 12 points).

Eileen Matya of Cedar Rapids responded for the honored class of 1946.

No response came from the class of '56, even though there were people from that class at the reunion. Either they were bashful, or they didn't want to brag about themselves, was probably the reason. It's not easy to get someone to figure out what to say in the amount of time given the people. But it would be hard to do it otherwise. (Editor's note: I would suggest that anyone planning to come to the reunion that is in an honored class, jot down some of the facts about their class before coming. These notes would help the person making the response).

The newest graduates were well represented, and Steven Gray responded for the class of '66. Mrs. Estella Miller, nee Sunderland of Cedar Rapids, a graduate of the class of '91, was recognized and she responded with a few remarks. Lester Bourn mentioned that Mrs. Miller's daughter (Bernice Wilson, nee Miller '15) was his first teacher and that she was attending this year's reunion.

Dr. William J. Reeder of Cedar Rapids was made an honorary member of the Cedar Rapids Alumni Association in recognition of the long service he has given the school (32 years on the school board - 23 years as president) and the community. Doctor and Mrs. Reeder were

guests at the dinner that evening.

An address was made by James Hutchison, president of the Cedar Rapids Board of Education. Mr. Hutchison married Mary Ellen Buechter, class of '45. Mr. Hutchison attended school at Spalding High school before moving to Cedar Rapids in 1948.

The speaker mentioned that Cedar Rapids high school was fully accredited by the state of Nebraska and that only seven others of its size were fully accredited in the state. He mentioned other facts regarding classes offered and equipment the school has acquired.

Lester Bourn asked that the alumni give thought to the fact that it might be better for the alumni association to meet less often than every year, due to the scale of our alumni reunions and the committees and manpower required to put it on every year. He also mentioned that it has been suggested that the dance be held on Saturday night and the rest of the reunion be held the next day. The reason being that the trip home would not be so late for those who wish to attend all the functions.

HONOR CLASSES

When the new officers met to make plans for the 1967 Alumni reunion it was decided, as in the past, to honor the classes of every ten years as well as the 25 year and 50 year classes.

And so, this year, Aug. 6, 1967, these will be the classes to be honored: 1967, 1957, 1947, 1942, 1937, 1927, 1917, 1907, and 1897.

In memory . . .

Dr. Wm. J. reeder passed away of a heart attack near Spalding on Sunday, Feb. 26, 1967. He was 73 years old. He died while driving his automobile after leaving Spalding. He was called to Spalding to treat a patient. He was a member of the Cedar Rapids Board of Education for 32 years.

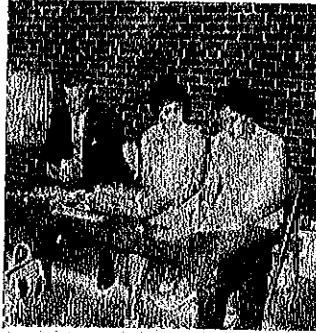

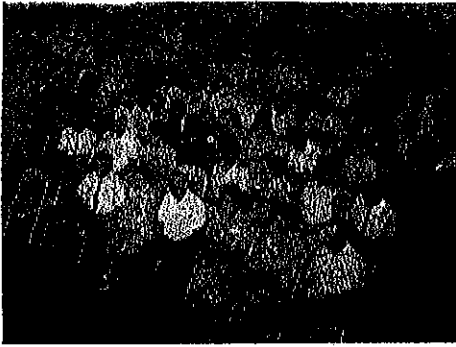

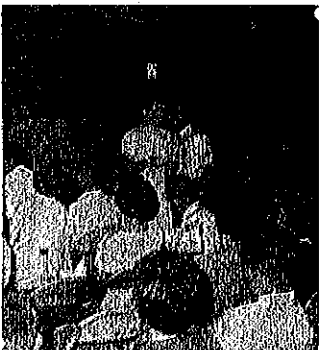
THE TRAVELING ALUMNI

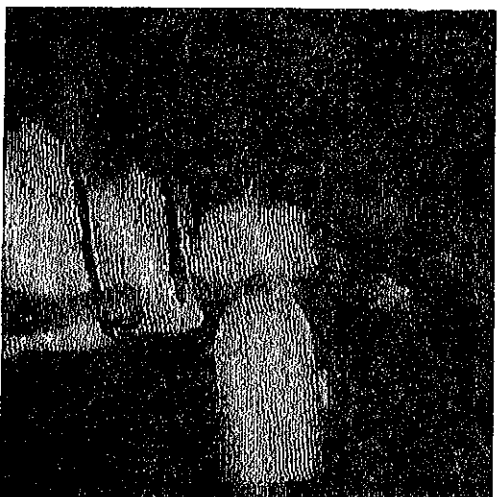

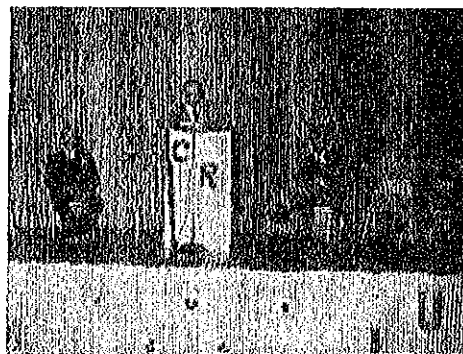

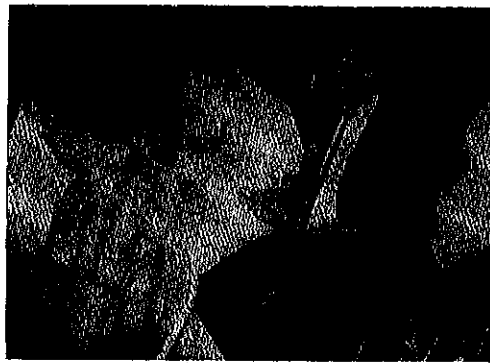
