## Cedar Rapids grads renew old memories and friends

The Cedar Rapids high school alumni met Sunday, Aug. 3, 1969, for the tenth successive reunion with 185 signing the register at the high school auditorium. A large crowd attended the dance at the open air pavillion Saturday evening and about 200 were on hand for the banquet at St. Anthony's dining room served by the St. Anthony's Altar Society.

James Gordon, '31, vice president, served as master of ceremonies at the afternoon program. Pastor Robert Reimer,

pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church led the invocation. Leonard Homan, '60, president, extended a welcome to alumni and friends. Musical selections were by the Dugan sisters of Greeley, the Swerczek family and the Channer sisters.

A moment of silent prayer was observed in memory of the deceased alumni then Master of ceremonies, James Gordon, presented the honor classes.

Cecil Cornwell of Belgrade responded for the 50 year (1919) class. Four members of this class were present.

Mrs. Maxine Ward McIntyre of Pasadena Ca, responded for the class of 1929. Jack DeWulf of Atlanta Ia, presented the class of 1939.

The 25 year class, 1944, was represented by Richard Jackson of Cedar Rapids. Alfred Schuele Jr., of Omaha spoke for the 20 year class, 1949. Barbara Batenhorst Kaup of Snyder responded for the ten year class, 1959 and Jim Heithoff did honors for the newest graduating class of 1969.

The meeting closed with benediction by Pastor Robert Reimer.

## New pool to be open this year

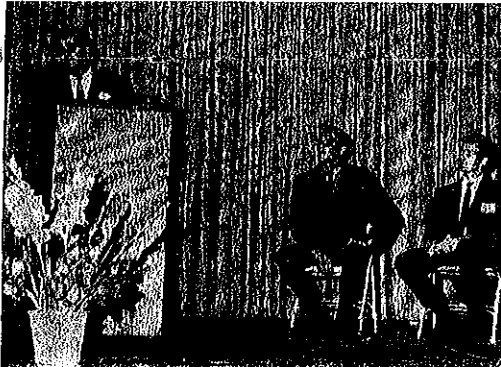

Early last summer the gears started turning to get a swimming pool and after considerable effort a special election was held to allow the village to issue a \$50,000 bond to build a swimming pool. The bond issue passed and a campaign for donations netted over \$8,000 for the project.

Construction got underway about Nov. 4 and has been progressing well - so see you at the swimming pool around June first.

## \$200,000 School Bond passed

Cedar Rapids District No. 6 voters turned out in record numbers, Tuesday, April 7, 1970, to pass a \$200,000 school bond issue 273 to 64.

This will make possible the purchase of the St. Anthony grade school building and the addition of a new gymnasium and music room to the high school.

## From the Records:

Oldest graduate with a paid membership in the Alumni association is Earl McClintick, class of 1899.

The class of 1949 had the unique distinction of being equally divided - 12 girls and 12 boys. They were also the first class to edit a school year book.

The school colors were once pink and green. The change to maroon and gold was made about 1917 or 1918.

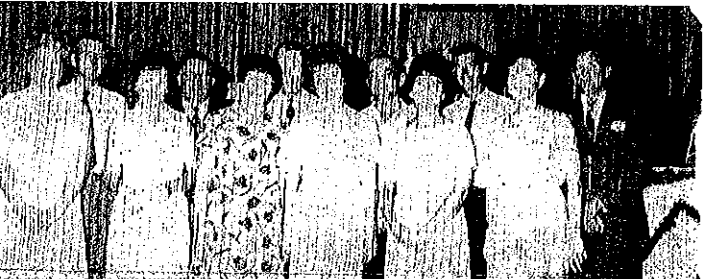
number to their grandparents, Cecil Cornwell and Blanche Green Cornwell, who were members of the 50 year 1919, honor classes.

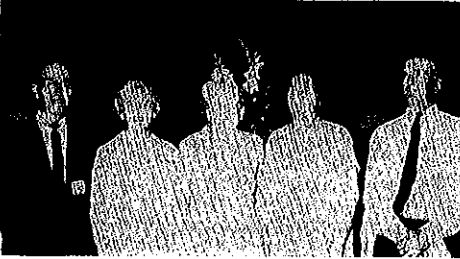

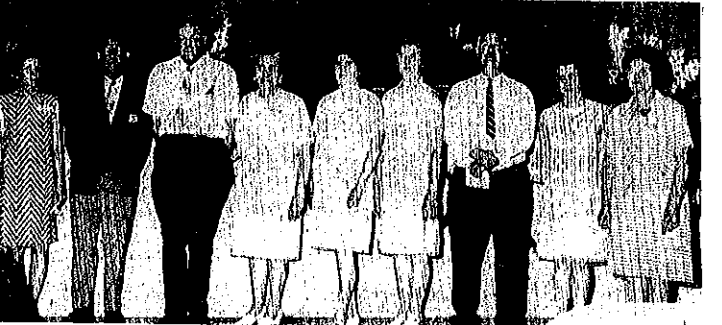

## Oldest Alumni member died

Earl E. McClintick, oldest alumni member holding a 1969 paid membership in the Cedar Rapids Alumni Association, died Feb. 2, 1967 in a Lexington, Nebraska hospital, at the age of 87 years.

He was born Oct. 15, 1882 at Cedar Rapids and graduated from the Cedar Rapids high school with the class of 1899. He became a registered pharmacist and practiced his chosen profession for over fifty years. He married Martha Sillik in 1909.

Funeral services and burial was at Eddyville Mo, where the McClinticks made their home for many years.

He is survived by two daughters, two sisters, a brother, eight grandchildren and six great grandchildren.

### ST. ANTHONY'S TO CLOSE

Former students of St. Anthony's parochial school will be saddened to learn that the school will close for the last time at the end of the 1969-70 term.

Early in the year it was announced that due to an ever increasing shortage of teaching nuns it would be necessary to make a decision concerning the future of the school and it was decided to close the school at the end of the current term. A decision of this kind brings many problems to a community and will take much discussion and time before a complete adjustment can be made.

The St. Anthony school was built in 1911 at a cost of \$18,000.00 dollars, under the dynamic leadership of the late Rev. Gentil Vermeulen. School opened for the first time in September 1912 with an enrollment

of 125 pupils. There were ten grades in four classrooms and four Dominican Sisters staffed the school.

By 1916 enrollment had reached 185 pupils in five rooms with a staff of seven Sisters, one a music teacher and one a cook.

A new church was built in 1918 and the old church was remodeled for a high school. In 1921 there were 26 students enrolled in four high school grades.

In the spring of 1928 a contract was let to build an addition of a gym and a sister's convent to the school.

Due to the depression and drought the high school was closed in 1933.

Smallest number ever to be enrolled in the school was 78 in 1950.

At the present time the enrollment is 104 students in eight grades, who will be attending the public school next fall.
