The clinic opened on March 13, 1977 and is enjoyed by Dr. Dam Thien Vu and the residents of Cedar Rapids and the surrounding area.

Through the efforts of the Cedar Rapids Community and area, the new clinic and acquiring a Doctor, has become

a reality. Volunteers from Primrose, Belgrade and Cedar Rapids worked together to achieve this goal.

Dr. Dam Thien Vu and his family came to Cedar Rapids in August of 1975. Since that time, Doctor Vu has received his medical license and began his medical practice in November of 1976 at Albion.

The 12 room clinic consists of an emergency room, lab, pharmacy, 3 exam rooms, Doctor's office, reception and waiting rooms, and 2 restrooms.

The building was erected by Ranch and Farm Agri Systems and the interior work was done by Loeffler Construction, Watts Electric all of Cedar Rapids, and Penne Plumbing of Belgrade.

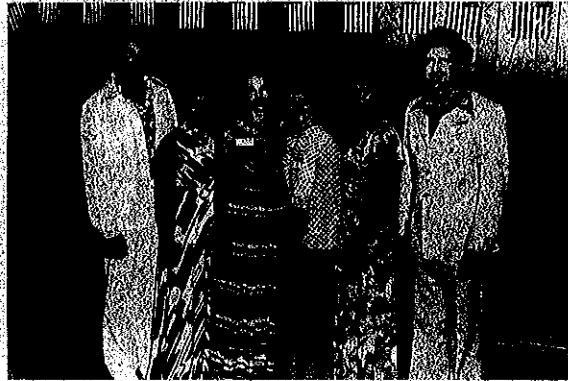

Girls' Basketball

Girls Achieve Five Year Goal

1976-77 Girls Basketball Team had compiled a record of 18 wins and 2 losses. The girls were runner up to Class "A" Kearney in the Ord Invitational, the girls took the loss as being a positive thing and came back to win the Goldenrod Conference two straight years in a row by conquering the Polk Cubs. The Tigers also went on to win the C-10 Districts by sinking the Strömsburg Vikings' ship. The Fighting Tigers then traveled to Newman Grove for a nail-biting Regional Play-Off game with Battle Creek. After a triumphant victory over Battle Creek the 1976-77 girls basketball team and their coach Doug Ackles achieved a goal this season that they have been striving for for five years. The Cedar Rapids Girls Basketball team traveled to the State Capitol to participate in the first modern-day State Girls Basketball Tournament.

The Tigers first game was with Republican Valley and was played in the beautiful new

Sports Complex. Cedar outlasted the Mustangs and qualified for the semi-finals of the State Tournament.

With the largest Cedar crowd ever assembled in the history of the town the Tigers, after an exciting game were finally upset by West Point.

The girls finished as the number 5 rated team in the state in Class "C".

In the five years that the girls started playing basketball they have an all around record of 58 wins and 7 losses. The girls have never lost a regular season game in five years.

This season the girls averaged 54 points a game while their opponents averaged 29 points a game. Kathy Kayton, a junior, was the leading scorer this season. Kathy averaged 20 points per game. She also was the leading rebounder with 10 rebounds per game. Kay Ahlers was the second leading scorer, averaging 14 points a game.

This year the girls received much recognition for their talent

of playing basketball. Marlene Mogensen was named to the second All-Conference Team. Kay Ahlers and Kathy Kayton were awarded first All-Conference Team and first team at the Ord Invitational. Kathy Kayton was also named to the first team All Tournament at State and All State by both the Omaha World Herald and the Lincoln Star. Kay Ahlers received Honorable Mention All State.

At this time the Girls Basketball team and their coach, Doug Ackles, would like to extend our deep appreciation to all the alumnus from Cedar who came and supported the team through out the season and also the people who followed the team to Lincoln. We were all proud to represent the super community of Cedar Rapids at the State Tourney. It really meant a lot to the team to see so many Cedar faces in that huge Sports Complex. Going to State was a perfect way to end a successful season.

Girls' Volleyball

1976-77 Volleyball team ended their season with a 14-5 record. The girls won first in the Goldenrod Conference by beating Polk. The girls also won District C-10 for the second year in a row by overpowering Palmer. The girls then went on to play Pleasanton at Ord for the regionals. It was a well fought first game but Pleasanton came out strong in the second game to crush the Tigers' dreams of going to state. Pleasanton went on to win the State Championship Class C.

The season was proven to be rewarding as two girls were named to the All-Conference Team, Marlene Mogensen and Bev McBride. Kathy Kayton, Sue Douthil, and Julie Kennedy were named to second team All-Conference. Later in the year Marlene Mogensen was awarded All-State Honorable Mention.

Coach Ann Bjorkland is looking forward to another exciting year of volleyball next year.

Girls' Track

The 1976-77 Girls Track Team worked very hard this year. There were 13 girls who lettered.

Cedar Rapids has the best mile relay in Goldenrod Conference with the time of 4:25. The relay team consisted of Lori Bloom, Sharon Kennedy, Darla Cook and Marlene Mogensen.

There really wasn't one outstanding individual this year. But Cedar has a very young team and is looking forward to next year.



Boys' Track

Track has had a very successful year for scoring points and placing in track meets. Cedar finished second at Wheeler Central Invitational. This was the first trophy to be brought home in a number of years.

Individual records were in good shape this season. School records were broken and tied. In the low hurdles, Rodney Olson broke and also tied the school record set by Eugene Demuth and Jerry Scott in 1963. The record was 22.3, now it is 22.2. Joe Kennedy's record in 1966 for the 440 yard dash was broken by Tom McPhillips at the Conference Track Meet in Central City. He set it at 53.3. In turn, Mike Choyeksi broke McPhillips' record 53.2.

Coach Dennis Paul feels that the team is showing improvement but is having difficulty placing in larger meets. He hopes that in the future years more interest will be given to track by the school.

Boys' Football

Football season was very disappointing as far as win-loss record is concerned. The weakest point was passing. The average for passing per game was 20 yards.

The football team was successful, however, in accomplishing an offensive game. As a team they averaged 225 yards in rushing offense.

Honors were given to Tim Kayton and Dan Braun. Kayton received All-Conference for offense and Braun for defense. Terry Towey, John Davlin, and Mark Penne received Honorable Mention. Tim Kayton was placed on the Grand Island Area first team. Dan Braun and Joe Swerczek were placed on the second team.

Kayton ranked 23rd in all classes in the state for yards gained. He had gained 1065 yards in 8 games. His best game was against Spalding Academy where he gained 245 yards on 20 carries.

Dan Braun was the leading tackler. He averaged 15 tackles per game.

According to Coach Paul, this year the main objective was to get the players back to playing fundamental football. Hopefully this will bring an improvement in the record for years to come.

Boys' Basketball

The basketball season for the boys ended the 1976-77 year with 8 wins and 11 losses.

At the Holiday Tournament at Wheeler Central, Cedar Rapids defeated Bartlett for the championship 61-56. Bartlett had previously defeated Cedar Rapids by 20 points.

Cedar had 6 games in which there was a scoring difference of 1 point.

The opponents' scoring average was 66.4 per cent per game, while Cedar Rapids scoring average was 64.6 per cent per game for the season.

Leading scorer was sophomore Terry Ahlers with 18 points per game. He was followed by Senior Ray Afrank with 14.6 points per game. Ray Afrank was also leading rebounder with 13 rebounds per game, and was honored by being named to the All-Conference Team.

In all, the season was improved by the players enthusiasm and spirit. Coach Paul Poczec looks forward to next years season with great expectations.
