

CHANGES IN THE SCHOOL

While the academic and co-curricular programs remain excellent at Cedar Rapids, programs such as vocational agriculture, family and consumer science (formerly known as home economics), Spanish, and economics have been shared with St. Edward. Spanish has been studied through a virtual reality classroom with Omaha Westside. "Expanding the use of distance learning technology and computer technology should make the delivery of some areas of the curriculum more efficient and beneficial to many students," said Superintendent Amy Malander.

Communication remains open with area schools regarding the future of education in rural Nebraska.

- The volleyball team finished their season with a record of 3-18.
- The football team's record was 4-4.
- Angela Dresch represented Cedar Rapids as the Harvest of Harmony queen candidate in Grand Island where the band earned an Excellent rating and tied for 6th place. The band received a Superior rating at the Conference music contest, and a Superior at Districts, earning a special plaque.
- A Veterans' Day Program was held, with Dan Cox Legion Post #44 presenting the Colors. The band played the Star Spangled Banner, and the 6th grade led the Pledge of Allegiance. Bonnie Chase and Adam VanDeWalle, both 2002 graduates of CRHS, and current members of the armed forces, addressed the crowd.
- The girls basketball team hustled through the season, and did achieve the first win for the girls in several years.
- The boys basketball team pulled through at the end of the season, earning a state tournament berth, finishing with an 11-11 record.
- The wrestling team continues to gain strength each year.
- Sara Rutten competed at the State Speech Meet in Kearney.
- The One-Act team placed fourth at the district competition with Brady Yosten, Tommy Krings, and Cory Scott receiving awards for superior acting.
- FFA members participate in many judging contests, contests, and state convention. State Degree recipients include Mike Dodds, Jarod Haschke, Dan Jarosz, Andy Reader, and Brandon Welch. Josh VanDeWalle earned an all-expense paid trip to Washington, D.C. with his essay on Risk Management.
- FBLA members attended competitions, conferences, and state conference. Brent Schuele, received first place in the Spelling contest, and in the Introduction to Business contest, earning the right to compete at the National FBLA Competition in June.
- The Quiz Bowl team took first place in the Goldenrod Conference Competition, and also first at Districts, qualifying for the State Quiz Bowl

The Adee Honey Farm recently installed a new loading dock and building addition. This business continues to remain a strong force in the local employment field.


The Cedar Cafe has been transformed into offices for PST.

The School Booster Club holds a variety show as a fundraiser in the early spring, followed a few weeks later by a Gospel Music Concert sponsored by the United Methodist Church,



SPECIAL ACTIVITIES PLANNED BY COMMUNITY CLUB


New events are planned for the Alumni Weekend by the Community Club. While plans are are still being formed, a flea market is planned for Saturday morning.

CEDAR BANK GIVES NEW LOOK TO MAIN STREET



The newest look on Main Street is the newly expanded and remodeled Cedar Rapids State Bank. The project doubled the size of the facility and added on a drive-up teller window. A time and temperature sign will be installed in the near future.


Remodeling and building on the Bank began last summer with the addition being built first, directly to the west. That included a new teller line and lobby, one office, large expanded workspace and the drive-up window. Eventually a temporary wall was built between new and old as work continued. Coping with dust, noise and more than a little confusion, staff moved into the new space in January.

The entire space of the old bank was then gutted. The newly remodeled space includes additional waiting area, three new offices, and a new vault/safe area that houses new safe deposit boxes. Also in the remodeled area is a combination board and break room large enough for small community meetings. Entrance to that board room is through a big old door that had been in the lobby of the old Bank.


